Course	Sustainable Leadership in the 21 st Century (8 ECTS/4 US credits)
Prior Requirements	Applicants must have an educational background equivalent to one year at a university before the beginning of the program. Open for undergraduate and graduate students, as well as professionals who have a university degree.

Teaching methods	Lectures, company visits, discussions, group work, individual journal (diary).
Aim and content	Leaders of the future will be faced with challenging tasks in an increasingly complex and interconnected world. The course will explore emerging ideas about leadership and provide practical training in leadership. The Nordic Leadership Model and Servant Leadership will be in special focus. Sustainability and social responsibility will be an important underlying theme and the role of social entrepreneurs will be examined. The course will include both academic lectures, discussion periods and more practical approaches that will include assignments, group work and field trips.
Learning outcomes	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students can demonstrate knowledge on classic and emerging leadership theories with focus on the Nordic Leadership model and Servant Leadership • Students can participate in discussion about the most relevant concepts and ideas related to leadership, sustainability and social responsibility. • Students can describe and explain key approaches in leadership and link them to topics associated with sustainability, social entrepreneurs and corporate social responsibility. • Students have developed skills to analyse cases and apply different leadership approaches to real practical settings. • Students can participate actively in creativity sessions, formulate their ideas, and communicate them with others in discussions and groupwork. • Students are able to ask critical constructive questions about 21st century leadership and take active part in discussions about sustainability and CSR.
